HOW TO GET TO INNSBRUCK

By car

Innsbruck is easily accessible through either the Inntal-Autobahn (A 12) or the Brenner Autobahn (A 13). Street signs indicate the way to the Congress Innsbruck which can be reached by either taking exit "Innsbruck-West" or "Innsbruck-Ost".

By train

Innsbruck is a railway junction with good Eurocity connections to Zurich (3,5 h), Munich (2 h), Vienna (5 h) or Bolzano (2 h). The main railway station is located close to the downtown area and to the main hotels (15 min walk to Congress Innsbruck). For information on train schedules please refer to www.oebb.at

By plane

Innsbruck has its own airport, located about 3 km from the city centre which can be reached either by public bus or by taxi (approx. € 10,-). From many international airports within Europe, such as Vienna, Amsterdam or Frankfurt there are several daily flights to Innsbruck. Furthermore, there is a direct connection to London Gatwick four times a week. However, you are advised to make early bookings since the planes flying to Innsbruck only have a limited number of seats.

Access to the city is further augmented by flying into **Munich airport** which is located some 180 km or a two-hour drive from Innsbruck.

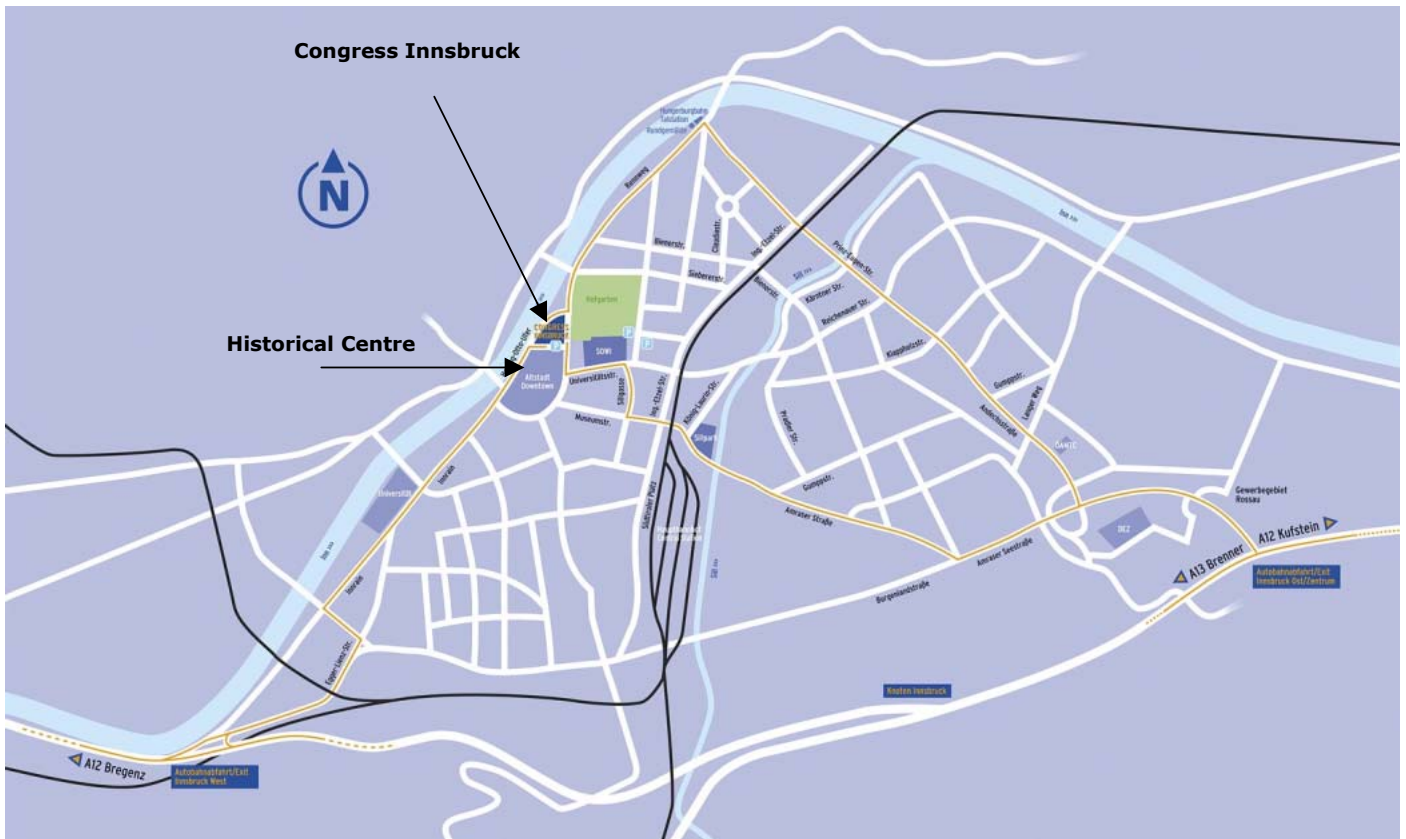

EXHIBITOR REGULATIONS 1/2

1) Registration

Applications for registration must be made within the stipulated registration period using the official registration forms. The allocation of exhibition space can only be considered if the correctly completed official registration form is received in good time. Applications received within the stipulated registration period will be considered for space allocation as available. However, med.ex reserves the right to refuse applications for any reason, which may or may not be communicated. The registration form must be accompanied by

- an illustrated brochure, or at least a precise description of the goods and articles to be exhibited, and
- a sketch or brief description of the envisaged layout of the stand.

To facilitate allocation procedures, any intended solid structures (walling, timber construction etc.) must be communicated to med.ex at the time of application. At all events, no solid structures shall be erected without the written consent of med.ex, and no such work shall be begun until this consent has been received. After the close of the exhibition exhibitors must ensure that the premises are returned to their original state. Exhibitors are not permitted to exchange allocated stands nor to transfer their right to occupy their allocated stand to a third party without the approval of med.ex.

2) Conditions of payment

Punctual payment of rental charges for the reserved exhibition space is a sine qua non for the occupation of the stand. Before occupying the allocated stand, the exhibitor shall present to med.ex receipts as proof of full payment of the rental plus surcharges.

All payments must be made in full and without deductions at least one month (30 days) prior to the beginning of the exhibition. Bills made out less than one month prior to the beginning of the exhibition are payable on receipt, in full and without deductions. After the exhibition, exhibitors will be invoiced for any additional or special services and facilities, such as technical equipment etc. In the case of default of payment interest will be charged on the arrears at the standard rate of the Austrian banks. Exhibitors undertake not to set off any counter demands against rental charges or surcharges due nor withhold rents as a setoff to an alleged counterclaim.

3) Repudiation or cancellation of the contract

No exhibitor may repudiate the exhibitor's contract once application has been submitted and accepted in writing. Should med.ex nevertheless agree to a cancellation of the rental agreement, the exhibitor shall be liable to pay in full the agreed charge for the reserved exhibition space, unless the agreement is cancelled at least one month (30 days) prior to the beginning of the exhibition and the exhibition space can be rented to another exhibitor, in which case the original lessee shall merely pay an administration charge of 30 % of the agreed rental charge plus registration fee.

4) Erecting and dismantling the stands

Any exhibitor who exceeds the allotted time for erecting or dismantling his stand shall be liable for all ensuing damage, injury and costs. In cases where an exhibitor fails to occupy his allocated stand on schedule, the provisions of paragraph 3 shall apply. Any exhibitor who has failed to appear on schedule shall not be entitled to receive compensation in any way, and med.ex shall dispose of the stand as it sees fit. Any damage or loss suffered by med.ex as a result of the default of the lessee shall be made good by the latter.

When decorating and furnishing their stands, exhibitors shall strictly observe the local fire regulations. Any easily flammable materials used (such as crepe paper, molinos, rush mats etc.) must be impregnated. Free and unrestricted access must be maintained to all fire alarm points, hydrants and emergency exits. Any exhibits left on the premises at the end of the dismantling period shall be removed at the exhibitor's expense and risk. In the interest of the success of the exhibition, no exhibitor shall commence dismantling before the close of the exhibition.

Any damage to floors and walls caused by the use of such materials as synthetic adhesives or nails shall be repaired by the exhibitor within the dismantling period. Failing that the premises shall be returned to their original state at the expense of the lessee. In all respects exhibitors must observe the local fire and building regulations and follow the instructions of the local fire and building authorities.

5) Lay-out of stands

Med.ex and/or the organisers will endeavour to meet the exhibitor's wishes regarding stand allocation. Should it be considered necessary in terms of the subject of the event, med.ex or the organisers shall be entitled to divide off the individual exhibitions areas by means of stable partitions (2,5 m high, 1,5 wide). The stand should be identified by an accurate company name. The design and furnishings of the stand must not offend against good taste, nor must they have a political character or disturb any persons or other furnishings and equipment. Exhibitors shall not affix any objects, including names of companies, products etc, at a height above the top of the stand partitions, which is 2,5m, nor employ the external face of the partitions for purposes of advertising, nor extend their stand beyond the agreed size without written permission from med.ex. Where permission has been given, the additional dimensions of the stand shall be taken to calculate the final, revised rental charges. Permission granted to exceed the normal height of the partitions shall in all cases be subject to approval of the lessees of all adjacent stands.

6) Floors

Maximum loads: Dogana: 500 kg/sq.m.- Gallery and foyers: 300 kg/sq.m.

When positioning heavy equipment etc., care must be taken to avoid lumped loads. In particular, care must be taken to avoid loads on the cable ducts laid in the floors as well as outlets (identified by the marble slabs), as these have considerably lower load-bearing capacities. Where necessary appropriate precautions must be taken as agreed with med.ex.

7) Advertising

Brochures and other advertising materials may only be distributed within the stand itself. Sound reproduction systems, such as tape recorders or films with sound tracks etc., may only be played at normal speaking volume. In the case of films, the screen must be positioned in such a way that the film can be viewed from within the stand without causing a hindrance in the gangway. Demonstrations involving the use of noisy machinery are only permitted on a limited scale. Med.ex reserves the right to restrict such demonstrations to certain specific times. The sale of food and beverages at the stand is not authorized.

8) Photography

The Convention Centre is entitled to make use of drawings, photographs etc. of the exhibition structures and stands for its own purposes or for general press releases. The Convention Centre's own accredited photographer has exclusive rights to all commercial photography.

9) Liability and security

Med.ex can only accept liability for damage or injury within the framework of its legal liability under Austrian law. The exhibitor shall be liable for personal injury and damage to property caused by himself, his agents or by his equipment and activities. No responsibility can be accepted by med.ex for other injury to life or limb or damage to property. The exhibitor shall display great diligence in the protection of his goods and exhibits, and all easily transportable items of value must be kept under lock and key during the night. The exhibitor himself is responsible for taking out appropriate insurance cover.

10) Cleaning

Med.ex shall be responsible for cleaning the halls and corridors with the exception of the stands, for which the respective exhibitors bear responsibility. However, the services of med.ex's cleaning staff can be hired for a fee upon written request. The exhibitors shall be responsible for the removal of all packing and wrapping materials.

Any articles or goods or packing materials placed in the entrance areas, corridors etc. or in the grounds and surroundings without written permission to do so will be removed at the expense and risk of the exhibitor concerned.

11) Assertion of claims

On submitting the official application from exhibitors shall be deemed to have accepted these Conditions for Exhibitors. Any claim against med.ex must be made in writing within 14 days of the close of the exhibition, after which period any action shall be statute-barred. In the event of litigation arising out of mutual obligations based on this agreement, the courts of Innsbruck shall have sole jurisdiction.
